Many thanks for your membership enquiry. Below are some details about our club which we hope you will find helpful, further details can be found on the club web site. Applicants must first attend a basic range safety course by arrangement, these courses are free and take place on a Mon/Wed & Fri evening. If you wish to attend a course please fill in the enclosed forms in **BLOCK CAPITALS** and return them to the club. We will be in touch to arrange a suitable date. Please do not just call in to the club as we can not allow people in to the club without prior arrangement.

New Members

New Members are always welcome at the Club but must first fill in the required membership forms. This is to do with Home Office Rules and also ensures we have somebody available who can look after them. All new members will be required to attend a Firearms Safety Induction Course before being allowed to shoot on the Range unaccompanied.

Fees

Membership fees are £100 PA, £50 for Juniors. Family members pay 50%

Range fees are £1 per visit, 50p for juniors.

The Committee

The Committee is elected at the club AGM each September by the members, we are a "not for profit sports club" run by the members for the members. No one in the club receives any wages.

Ranges

The club has two indoor ranges, both 50m long with eight firing points on each range. We can cater for all shooting disciplines and run regular monthly competitions for those of a competitive nature. We also have use of Altcar Rifle Ranges for outdoor shooting up to 600 yds.

FIREARMS SAFETY – THE RULES

1. TREAT ALL FIREARMS AS THOUGH THEY ARE LOADED – If in doubt – ASK.
2. NEVER POINT A FIREARM AT ANYTHING YOU ARE NOT GOING TO SHOOT – BE AWARE OF WHERE THE MUZZLE IS AT ALL TIMES.
3. KEEP YOUR FINGER OFF THE TRIGGER AND OUTSIDE THE TRIGGER GUARD UNTIL YOU ARE ON TARGET AND YOU HAVE MADE THE DECISION TO FIRE.
4. ALWAYS BE AWARE OF YOUR TARGET AND WHAT IS DIRECTLY BEHIND IT. REMEMBER BULLETS DON'T STOP WHEN THEY HIT PAPER.
5. NO FIREARMS TO BE HANDLED IN THE CLUB ROOM, TINKERING, CLEANING OR VIEWING TO BE DONE IN THE 'FUMBLE ROOM' BEHIND THE CLUB ROOM.
6. WHEN TRANSPORTING GUNS TO AND FROM RANGES THEY MUST BE UNLOADED AND EITHER KEPT IN BAGS OR HAVE A BREACH FLAG IN THEM.
7. UNDER NO CIRCUMSTANCES MUST A LOADED OR JAMMED FIREARM BE REMOVED FROM THE FIRING POINT. IF THERE IS A PROBLEM, STAY WITH THE FIREARM AND ALERT ANOTHER MEMBER WHO WILL ALERT A RANGE OFFICER.

SHOOTING IS ONE OF THE SAFEST SPORTS KEEP IT THIS WAY
